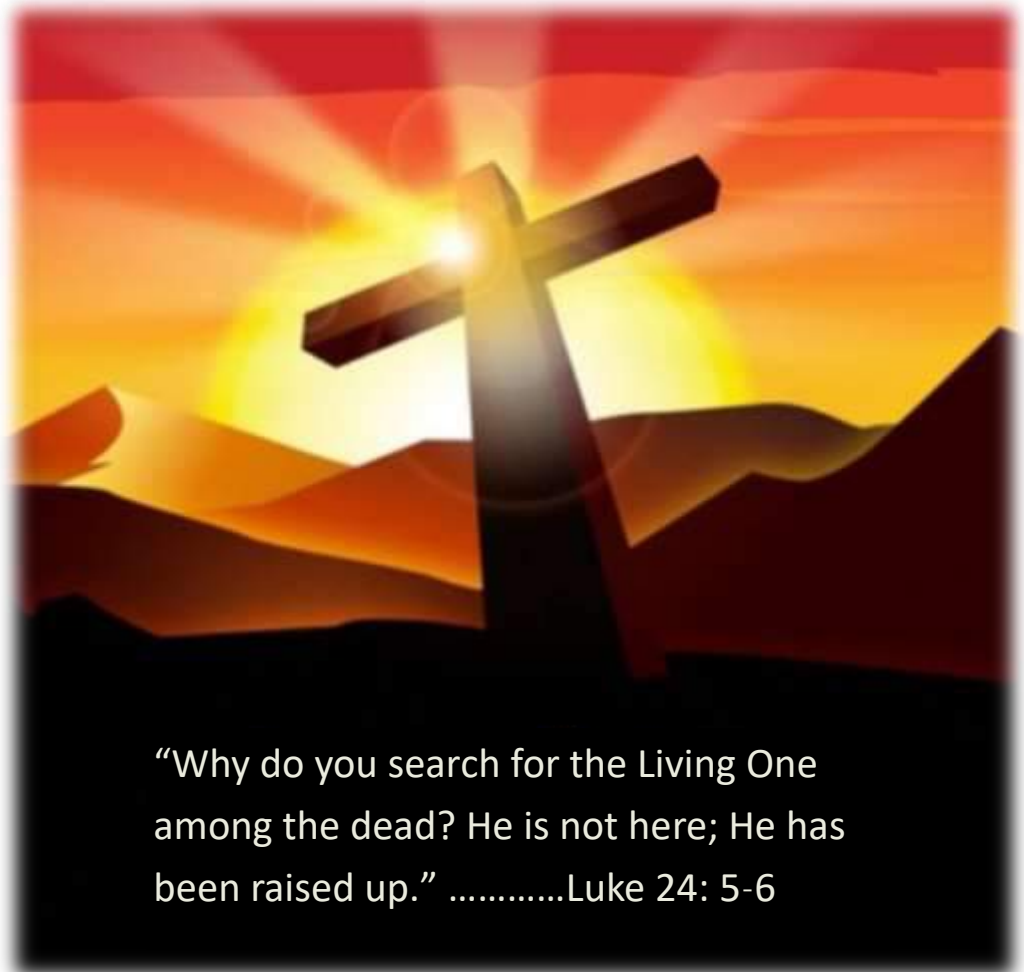

**Easter** - Throughout Lent we refrain from singing or even saying Alleluia, but on Easter this ancient song of praise rings out. Bring this glorious Alleluia home with you after Mass. Throughout Easter day, observe an ancient tradition and greet one another with "Alleluia, praise the Lord", or "Alleluia, He truly is Risen!". On this, the highest feast of the Church year, we give ourselves to joyful, unceasing praise. Today's feasting and songs of praise are practice for the abundant, joyful life of Heaven. Saint Augustine's beautiful words say it well: "O blessed Alleluia of Heaven! No more anguish, no more adversity, no more enemy, no more love of destruction. Up above, praise to God, and here below, praise to God. Praise mingled with fear here, but without disturbance above. Here the one who chants must die, but there he will live for ever. Here we chant in hope, there, in possession; here it is Alleluia en route, there it is Alleluia on arriving home."



My Easter wish for each of us is a day filled with God's Choicest Blessing. Rejoice today in such a glorious gift that is promised each of us. 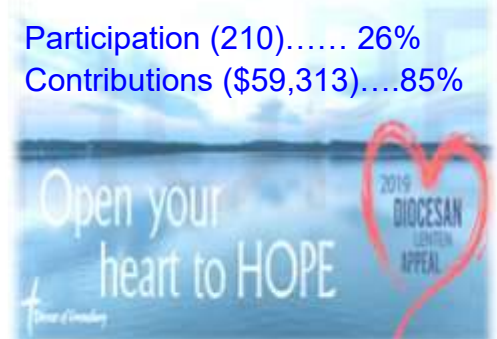

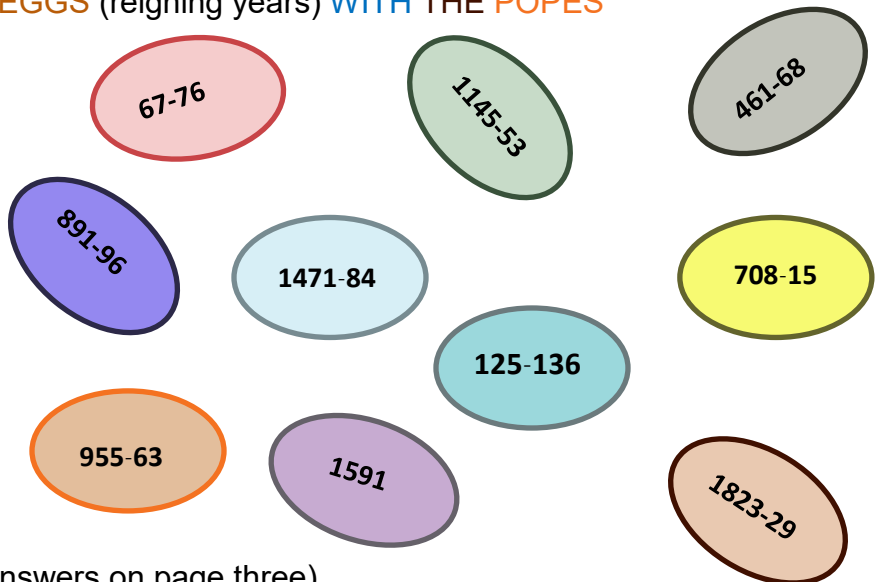
