# Our Shepherds

## His Holiness Pope Leo XIV, Supreme Pontiff of the Universal Church

Pope Leo XIV, elected in 2025 as the first American Pope, hails from Chicago. Before his election, he was Cardinal Robert Prevost. Known for his pastoral heart, theological clarity, and commitment to evangelization, Pope Leo brings a renewed focus to the vital role of the parish in the life of the universal Church. Pope Leo spent more than two decades in Peru, where he became a naturalized citizen and served as a missionary and Bishop. He is fluent in English, Spanish, Italian, French, and Portuguese, and also reads Latin and German.



## The Most Reverend Larry J. Kulick, J.C.L., Bishop of Greensburg

Bishop Larry J. Kulick, J.C.L., is the sixth Bishop of Greensburg, having been appointed by Pope Francis on December 18, 2020, and consecrated on February 11, 2021. He is the first native Bishop of the Diocese, hailing from Leechburg. His episcopal motto is *Christus est veritas* ("Christ is the truth"), reflecting his deep devotion to truth rooted in the Gospel. He is steadfastly committed to strengthening and nurturing our parishes, ensuring they remain vibrant centers of faith and service for generations to come.

## Father Daniel E. Carr, Pastor

Father Daniel E. Carr, a native of Greensburg, was ordained in June 2018 by Bishop Edward C. Malesic. He served as Parochial Vicar in Connellsville and Mount Pleasant prior to coming to Saint Regis Parish; he was installed as Pastor in July 2024. He enjoys reading, playing video games, and spending time with his family.



## Father Daniel Iletogbe, Parochial Vicar

Father Daniel Iletogbe, a native of the Diocese of Ilorin in Nigeria, has been serving the Diocese of Greensburg since his appointment as Parochial Vicar on January 8, 2025. He faithfully ministers to the communities of Saint Regis Parish and Saint Barbara Parish in Harrison City, bringing pastoral care and international missionary experience to his parish assignments.



## Deacon Jeff Cieslewicz

Deacon Jeff Cieslewicz was ordained a Deacon by Bishop Lawrence E. Brandt in June 2015. Before coming to Saint Regis Parish, he served at Saint John Baptist de La Salle Parish, Delmont, Saint Mary, Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, Export, Immaculate Conception Parish, Irwin, and Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish, North Huntingdon. He works full time as a PCB technician at Cleveland-Price. He is married and has two children and three grandchildren.
